## ORDER ON THE COURT'S JURISDICTION OVER THE CLASS

In its order of February 14, 2000 denying the Defendant's motion to dismiss complaint, the Court reserved the issue of jurisdiction over the class. Judge Mahoney issued an opinion in a series of similar cases<sup>1</sup> on February 15, 2000, holding that the District Court and the Bankruptcy Court have subject matter jurisdiction over these matters and that the matters are core proceedings under 28 U.S.C. §157(b). The Court finds that the allegations of the Smiths'

complaint are substantially similar to the cases before Judge Mahoney. This Court concurs with

Judge Mahoney's opinion of February 15, 2000, and adopts it in the present action. Based on the

legal conclusions stated in Judge Mahoney's opinion of February 15, 2000 in the cases

referenced above, the Court finds that the District Court and the Bankruptcy Court have subject

matter jurisdiction over these matters and that the matters are core proceedings under 28 U.S.C.

§157(b). It is hereby

**ORDERED** that the Defendant's motion to dismiss based on lack of subject matter

jurisdiction is **DENIED**.
